**1. Opening:** The Business Meeting of South Florida Area 15 Panel 63 was opened by Chairperson Annie C. at 9:00 AM with the Serenity Prayer. The Preamble was read by: **Faith**; The 12 Traditions were read by: **Michael**; and the 12 Concepts were read by: **Sherri**.

**2. Chairperson's Remarks:** Good morning Area 15. I'm an alcoholic and my name is Annie C. My home group is the Meat & Potatoes Group in Vero Beach. Thank you for the privilege of serving as your Area 15 Chairperson. How many new GSR's and Alternate GSR's are here today? We welcome you to Area 15. Please feel free to contact any of the Area Officers if you have any questions, tips or comments. We are here to serve you! Please be sure to purchase your banquet ticket for the April 2014 Assembly – District 2 members are selling them outside in the foyer today. Thank you to District 9 for hosting a wonderful quarterly. Thank you Kathy for sharing your experience, strength and hope with us on Friday night and thank you Clay joining us this weekend and for sharing your experience, strength and hope with us last night. It has been wonderful getting to know you. This past quarter we had 2 motions submitted after the deadline. The cutoff date for the submission of motions is **February 4<sup>th</sup> at 10:00PM**. Please visit the Chairman's page of our Area 15 website for review of the motion cutoff date and access any other information needed. If you send me an email or a motion by email and you do not receive a response from me within 24 hours; please consider it not received and contact me by phone. My phone number is on the full version of the Area 15 Agenda page. In December I was invited to attend & share at the FL Bid for ICYPAA business meeting. The enthusiasm to become active in service at various levels was great to see. I hope you had a chance to stop by the information table this weekend. Our young AA's are our future leaders. During this past quarter it became necessary to poll the Area 15 Officers regarding the re-instatement of our Non-profit Bulk Mail Permit and the printer Area 15 has done business with since 2001. Since the anonymity & welfare of our Area was concerned, we needed to make an informed decision as outlined in our 12 Traditions. Each Officer was given the necessary information to review and by **substantial unanimity the decision has been made to resume using our Non-profit Bulk Mail permit (permit No. 1896) located at the Boca Raton Post Office and return to the printer we have used located in Pompano Beach since 2001.** It was necessary to write a Letter of Reinstatement on the Area 15 Letterhead, pay the renewal fee of \$200 and add \$300 to the bulk mail fund. On December 4, 2013 the Letter of Reinstatement and any associated fees were personally submitted to the Post Office. Our Non-profit Bulk Mail Permit No. 1896 is now active and ready for use by our Recording Secretary so we can send our mailings at the Non-profit mail rates beginning with the first set of minutes for 2014. Later in today's meeting we will be bidding on quarterly locations for the period of July 2014 through April 2015. Please pay close attention to the dates and locations being presented. Please remember that reports are limited to 3 minutes. As they will be timed, I will give you a loving hint when you have 10 seconds remaining. At 3 minutes, I will thank you for your report. We have a lot of business to take care of today, so let's get started! Love & Service Annie C.

**3. Registrar:** Good morning South Florida and Thank You District 9 for bringing us back to Fort Lauderdale. My name is Dutch V. N. and I am an alcoholic, my sobriety date is July 25 1985 and my home

group is the Royal Palm group in Vero Beach; I serve you as your Panel 63 Registrar. Thank you Kathy for a wonderful talk on Friday, and Clay, thank you so much for your inspiring lead on Saturday. Happy New Year to all, may you find peace, happiness, health and serenity throughout the year. It has been a short and busy three months. As promised, Bruce had the on-line forms for the district Registrars ready in a little less than two weeks, after a few minor hiccups, the system appears to be working well. The learning curve was steeper than at first thought, so I requested our Quarterly Coordinator to see if we could squeeze in a registrar workshop for 9 am Saturday, she obliged and most of the district Registrars spent a good hour together yesterday, and I believe we are ready to have the system being used by all districts. The system saves a lot of time both for the district and Area Registrar. Due to the sensitive nature of the data and the need for accuracy between AZURE and FNV, access to the database is administered by the Area Registrar and is limited to Area Registrar, the district registrars and the Area 15 officers. At our regular meeting at 12:30 yesterday afternoon, we discussed the various formats used for inputting information, for example, there are several formats available for inputting dates in Azure, but only one of them is compatible with FNV. We also discussed the discrepancy between AZURE and FNV as to what constitutes an Active group, GSO's use of the data serves a different purpose than ours, FNV has a category called "UNKNOWN", that would be a group still meeting but not have anyone as a contact person listed for that group. If we add the FNV "Active" and "Unknown" categories instead of being off by 469 groups, we have narrowed the gap to 139. Still too much, but with that number we may be able to close the gap more or eliminate it altogether. The numbers are as follows Azure has 2,254 active groups, and the combined active and unknown categories in FNV comes to 2,115. There are still groups sending their information directly to GSO. Unfortunately when information is sent directly to GSO, the Area is not notified. The same with new groups, if you submit a new group form directly to GSO, you will get a number, but please understand that I do not get notified of any new groups, The literature says the group, the Area Delegate and the Area Registrar are notified upon the conclusion of the 30 day wait period, but I have only received one notification, and that was early January 2013. Please use the system in place, group changes and new groups go to district, from there to Area and on to New York. Due to the volume of work performed by the understaffed records department in New York, it is faster to register groups through the Area. Any group change forms or new group forms sent directly to the Area Registrar will be entered in the Azure and FNV databases and the appropriate District notified of the change or new group. Kathy L. and Clay R., thank you for sharing your Experience, Strength and Hope with us on Friday and Saturday evenings. I especially would like to thank the members that had the foresight to submit their reports prior to and during the assembly. This is extremely helpful. Please submit your reports to me today or by next Wednesday to ensure the Spanish translation and the printing of the minutes goes smoothly. I would like to make a correction to the October 2013 minutes by removing any motion that was from the agenda that had not been seconded and any motion that had been withdrawn. Also, I would like to apologize to District 3 for putting their report in the District 10 slot. I pursued updating the bulk mail permit in Tampa. After running the newspaper ad for the "Doing Business As (DBA)" in the newspaper at the cost of \$58.13, I attempted to apply for the DBA. I was unable to follow through with this because we are not registered with the state and to do so would break tradition 11. It required the panel to be associated on public record with our 501c3 non-profit name, "South Florida Area Conference of Alcoholics Anonymous". I returned the remaining funds allotted for this to the treasurer. This has definitely been a learning experience and I will probably be great at this job when I rotate out. Who received mailed October minutes this last quarter? Please raise your hand. Who received January agendas with their minutes? Please raise your hand. Who received minutes with this printing error? Please raise your hand. Our mailing service had not sent out all the agendas with the minutes and to amend for this the company printed new agendas and mailed them out at their own expense. This delayed the receipt of the mailed version but was available by email when requested and on our Area 15 website. If you did not receive emailed or mailed minutes, please make sure

At the Secretary/Registrar meeting yesterday, I went over the process of obtaining the bulk mail permit and the results with helpful feedback. **January 2014 Report** - Hello Area 15, I am Robin and I am an alcoholic, my sobriety date is June 25, 1993. Grateful to serve as District 10 Chairperson. We would like to thank you at District 9 for hosting a fabulous quarterly. We would like to welcome Mike R, as our new Registrar. **The Treatment Committees** - The vision going forward for our Man on the Bed (MOB) service, which has successfully engaged the services of 153 A.A. volunteers at the 3 hospitals in the county since inception in March 2012. Based on the success of this initiative: a. Baptist Health Systems is adopting S Miami Hospital's (SMH) new entire facilities' staff education model to identify alcohol at risk admissions and the subsequent intervention by ATRC (Addiction Treatment Recovery Center) physicians and counselors system wide. All of Baptists' 7 hospitals will be engaged over the next 18 to 24 months and our Man on the Bed (MOB) 12 Step call service to the patient's bedside will be an integral part of this roll out. We will need 300 volunteers for this service with a year or more sobriety. b. Jackson/ UM Med Center continues to work on a similar SMH model in which MOB will be engaged. In addition, part of the newly granted 840 million dollar expansion is being petitioned to establish Jackson's own rehabilitation facility. We are expected to participate with regular AA panel detox meetings should this be built. We will need 200 volunteers for Jackson just for our MOB activities. + The economic impact of the start in 2014 of the new health care regulations and the opportunities for service for the fellowship going forward:: a. All the sudden interest in our fellowship's services is in part being driven by a new health care law provision effective Jan 1, 2014. Heavy penalties will be levied to hospitals public and private that readmit patients within 30 days with similar presenting conditions. SMH estimates this could be many millions of dollar penalties for them alone. + Current direct immediate impact is the approximately 130 newly requested monthly AA panel one hour meetings at facility openings for volunteers, including the new private Detox facility Harbor Village, the Behavioral Units at Mt Sinai, Mercy, Aventura and VA hospitals. We have scheduled sit downs with staffs at Larken and Kendall West behavioral units in the coming weeks as they have expressed interest in our services. A recent call to meet with a youth facility substance abuse rehabilitation unit in Florida City is near term. This private facility unit has 19 other facility locations state wide. We need between 60 to 80 new Facilitators with a year or more of sobriety to take these new weekly meeting commitments, along with many Speakers to accompany them with 90 or more days of

We need to build a healthy supply list of willing volunteers for Facilitators to commit to take weekly meetings, Speakers to go with them, 12 Step MOB volunteers and Bridging the Gap ambassadors. b. We are asking Treatment Liaisons, GSRs, DCMs and Intergroup Reps to assist us with sign-up sheets we developed to accumulate the currently needed and near future volunteer needs and return them to the monthly Treatment meeting at the Coral Room the 2nd Sat. of month at 3 pm or to our next District 10 meeting in January on the 7th at 7 PM. + The committee has tasked the sorting and organization of volunteer contact lists into separate gmail accounts by zip code to enhance communications and alerts of new service opportunities. These accounts are for MOB, Facilitators, Speakers and BTG volunteers. + A Treatment Google website is under development to track and post a calendar of current and new treatment facility meetings county wide that AA members may access to sign up for service via the Gmail accounts and download meeting formats and facility procedures. This will be linked to the District10Miami.org web site.+ Attendance at our monthly meetings has blossomed to 27 at our December meeting with all chair, co-chair, secretary, literature, BTG, events, web site and 3 volunteer email coordinating positions filled.+ BTG (Bridging the Gap) had 21 bridges in the 4th quarter with a noticeable uptick in requests after the July introduction of our District approved distribution of a self-printing mini 12 Step Meeting Room pamphlet with BTG contact information prominently displayed on the front panel. The facilities make in house copies of this pamphlet available to their patients. First, I want to thank my home District, District Nine, for hosting a special Happy New Year Quarterly Assembly with lots of fun and spirit. We have over 750 folks registered for this Quarterly. We want to thank our hard working volunteers who deserve our appreciation. Let's give them a round of applause. We also want to thank our speakers, Kathy and Clay for great talks. The Hospitality Room has been great and we want to thank all of those groups who served and helped everyone out. The Volume II, First Printing of The Willing Times, a two page summary of my report, is available up front here and on the tables. Second, Graham and I attended the Second "SSAASA," the Southern States Alcoholics Anonymous Service Assembly, in Baton Rouge, Louisiana on behalf of the Area. While we were there, we attended several workshops with various service themes, including some chaired by our Past Trustees, Don Massey and Howard Lowery. Don began the "General Service Structure" meeting and discussed how the structure works and various aspects of the General Service Conference. He noted it was "divinely inspired," it works really well in letting the groups know what is going on, especially what happens to the money they contribute, the Conference is a quality control vehicle which allows groups to voice their opinions, and it also allows communication to flow back to the groups. Mr. Lowery also stated his opinion that there are two service structures, the traditional one with the groups on the top, and the other with New York and GSO at the top. This thought is based on the groups basically letting GSO do what it wants until they do something the groups don't like and then they throw a fit and bring a proposed Agenda Item to change it. This is exactly our Area's opinion

of GSO unilaterally taking out over 40% of our Area Service Highlights after telling us they were only going to do “minor editing” along the lines of grammar and punctuation changes. Howard also felt the membership has given the A.A. World Services (AAWS) and AA Grapevine, Inc. (AAGV) Boards their position at the top of the triangle for two reasons. First, if we give GSO direction on an issue, they only follow it about 50% of the time. He gave the example of the staff retirement pensions that the groups wanted to change to 401(k) plans years ago. He also mentioned was the LaVina still being printed despite continuous deficits for years. Of equal significance, he also mentioned our members complaining about the printing of stories that the Spanish speaking folks do not identify with since they use an unfamiliar and/or minority Spanish dialect and the free LaVina type magazines available on the internet from their home countries. Howard also told us if there is no direction from the groups, GSO and the Boards do whatever they want. To combat this, Howard recommended three things. First, the groups should communicate better with each other, their members, GSO, and the Boards. Second, the groups must show leadership on the issues facing A.A. Third, he suggested we send information to the groups all the time, especially using free e-mail to a group GSR or other member of the group. I also attended meetings on “Concepts 3, 4, and 5,” “Concepts 7, 8, and 11,” “The General Service Board and its Companies, AAWS and AA Grapevine, Inc.,” “AAWS and AA Grapevine Inc. Boards,” “Service Sponsorship,” and the “SSAASA General Sharing Session.” I am preparing a detailed summary of these workshops and will post them on the Delegate’s Section of the web and will be glad to email them to anyone who wants one. I am also going to include summaries provided by some of the other 12-14 folks who attended SSAASA from our Area. It was a great turnout. I strongly urge you guys to talk with those who went to SSAASA to get a sense of how much service growth was going on and the spirit of service in the air. It was awesome. I do want to share some points from the General Sharing Session to give you a feeling of the wonderful opportunities to grow we had there. The workshops gave us great information on the GSO, AAWS, and AA Grapevine Boards, the payment of Group Services, Forums, and the General Service Conference expenses being paid by the groups for around \$4.2 million, and the groups contributing \$6.2 million per year, with this amount not covering the operating and travel expenses of GSO. Of greatest significance was the involvement of the Alternate GSRs, GSRs, ACMs, DCMs, District Committee Chairs and Officers, and Area Committee Chairs and Officers, and others leading workshops and helping others with their experience strength and hope in their particular position. In fact, I was one of the few Delegates who helped chair a workshop. This only occurred after they called on the Wednesday night before the Assembly when one of their District Archives Chairs could not make it. Folks also commented on the “enthusiasm for service” in a “person by person” and “job by job” way. In essence, it was service in action, holding nothing back. I was very impressed and learned a lot from each workshop. We should strongly consider bidding on hosting the Fourth SSAASA so all of our service folks can benefit from listening to others sharing their experience in doing the same job as they are. This sharing includes folks in: 1. The very beginning positions of Alternate GSRs, and GSRs; 2. The next level of service, the position of ACMs and DCMs; 3. The District positions of District Committee Chairs like Archives and District Officers; and 4. The Area positions of Committee Chairs and Area Officers. Given the input of several folks from our Area 15 there thoroughly enjoying this educational and enthusiastic adventure, I told the SSAASA body that, although I did not have any authority from the Area or any hotel contracts, that the South Florida Area 15 would put in an “Intent to Bid” to host the Fourth SSAASA with North Florida Area 14. This “Intent to Bid” does not bind the Area in any way, shape or form. Instead, it simply gives us a foot in the door should we decide to pursue it. This “Intent to Bid” was received with great excitement and interest by the SSAASA body. Although I do not have an opinion on A.A. issues as the Area Delegate, I think it would be a tremendous boost to our service experience and growth for everyone in our Area, both in and out of General Service positions. The 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Big Book is still on track and will cost \$12. The orders for this gem are pouring into GSO according to my good friend Michelle, the GSO Archivist. She told me in November that they had selected paper as close to the original as possible and they are trying to match up the colors of the “circus” jacket as close as possible since, believe it or not, there is no record of the original colors used. Just another curious fact about A.A. Michelle is also coming down to Orlando for the First Florida Alcoholics Anonymous Workshop February 14 and February 15 being hosted by our own Archives Chair, Karla, and Area 14 and their Archives Chair. The former Akron Intergroup Archives Chair, and current Board of Trustee Member of Dr. Bob’s House, Gail L., will also be presenting two different talks. This is an excellent adventure you should not miss. The November GSO Board Meeting Minutes

reviewed the current financial figures. To the end of September, literature sales generated \$9.7 million in gross sales, \$125,000 more than budgeted. Also, we have sold 1815 Big Book and 1698 12 + 12 ebooks for this year. AAWS also recommended reducing the pricing of the ebooks to less than the same hard cover books. The Grapevine subscriptions are down to 77,869 this year to date, down 6,302 from last year, while eGrapevine subscriptions totaled 5,165 so far. LaVina circulation had 10,010 subscriptions, with a current loss of \$103,650, \$10,133 more than budgeted. On a positive note, the Spanish language Grapevine Daily Quote has now been launched. The General Service Conference Trustees Committee agreed to forward a request to the Trustee's Literature Committee to renew the use of the "circle and triangle." The specific request was to have the Committee "consider granting the approval to use the "circle and triangle" with the words recovery/unity/service as an unofficial service mark on A.A. literature where the Publishing Department determines it is appropriate." A number of folks have told me over the years that they would like to have the "circle and triangle" be brought back to A.A. Literature. The new Box 459 Winter Issue has great stories on AAWS Online Literature Sales, The Big Book: A.A.'s Oldtimer in Print, Bringing the A.A. Message to "Stand Down Veterans, Frequently Asked Questions about the 2015 International Convention, Group Finances, and New Photos From G.S.O.'s Archives. Box 459 is available on the aa.org website for free. We also have invited Billy Noonan, AAWS Chair, to speak at our January, 2015 Quarterly Assembly and he has agreed to come. I have given 17 General Service Conference Reports to the Districts, have one more scheduled, and have two Districts with no dates scheduled so far. I am trying to set up dates for these last two Districts and hope to do so soon. We will be scheduling the dates for this year's Delegate Reports at the next Assembly. As I discussed above, the GSO took out more than 40 percent of my report, including my main summary paragraph and the next to last paragraph. This despite their agreement to do very minor editing for punctuation, spelling and similar grammatical type things so that the entire GSC Report would flow better and be in a similar style. I am preparing the proposed Agenda Item and background information that this body gave a sense of the meeting in favor of. The proposed Agenda Item is very simple: Agenda Item - To return to the 2010 Advisory Action which forbids any editing of the Area Service Highlights. So far, we will be joined by North Florida Area 14 and approximately five or more Areas in bringing this proposed Agenda Item. I am compiling all the responses to date to my request for input from other Delegates about the improper editing of their reports and whether their Areas support a proposed Agenda Item prohibiting this from happening again, and will forward the proposed Agenda Item to New York before the January 15, 2014 deadline. Also, if anyone else wants to submit a proposed Agenda Item, it must be submitted into the GSO office on or before January 15, 2014. Anyone can submit an Agenda Item, including someone with only eight (8) days of sobriety, or less. This is especially true if they are upset about not being able to use a group name even though another group who had that name in their District no longer meets. I also was invited to District 14 to give the General Service Conference Report to the U.S. and British Virgin Islands, Antiqua, and St. Maarten. I was greeted with great enthusiasm and love by one of our remote communities Districts as I shared the Conference Report and my story during their "Christmas Brunch." I also had the privilege of attending their quarterly District Meeting for two hours after the Brunch and shared some experience strength and hope with them. I also became an honorary member of the Red Hook Brethren Pirates at one of the local establishments owned by one of our members. I want to thank George and all the other members of District 14 for their wonderful hospitality.
