1. Opening: The Business Meeting of South Florida Area 15 Panel 65 was opened by Chairperson Shirley P. at 9:00 AM with the Serenity Prayer. The Preamble was read by: **Sherri D.**; The 12 Traditions were read by: **Carlos**; and the 12 Concepts were read by: **Heather**.

2. Chairperson's Remarks: Good morning Area 15. My sobriety date is July 13, 1994 and my home group is the Women in the Solution in Sarasota. My name is Shirley P. and I am an alcoholic. Thank you for the privilege of serving as your Area 15 Chairperson. How many new GSR's and Alternate GSR's are here today? We welcome you to Area 15. Please feel free to contact any of the Area Officers if you have any questions. We are here to serve you! Please be sure to purchase your banquet ticket for the October 2016 Assembly – District 9 members are selling them outside in the foyer today. Thank you to District 8 for hosting our quarterly. Our speakers were inspiring, I would like to thank them for sharing their experience, strength and hope with us this weekend. Per resolution, I attended both the Current Practice Committee and the Finance Committee meetings. During the District Chair meeting, we discussed how some districts have worked together to have the Delegate combine more than one district conference report, the fact is that it saves in cost and it provides great fellowship amongst the neighboring districts. Attention to all: We discussed a situation, which arose from the new quarterly hotel contract negotiations and procedures. The Area 15 Chairperson serves as a registered agent for the 501C3. Per current practice the Area 15 Chair signs hotel contracts as the registered agent. At this particular weekend there was an issue that came up when the hotel required that the Food and Beverage Order and a Food Waiver for the Hospitality Suite needed to be signed. After much discussion and suggestions with the District Chair and District Quarterly Coordinator it became clear that for an individual trusted servant to sign the food waiver on behalf of the district would expose them to personal liability. I then requested that our Treasurer look into providing a rider on our Liability Insurance to cover any food in the hospitality suite, I then signed both documents. This was brought to the attention to the Quarterly Coordinator Committee. At the end of the minutes you will find the job description of the Area 15 Chair, in addition you will find the requirements to stand for an Area 15 officer position, and the suggestions to be an Area 15 being a trusted servant. We encourage you review and make yourself available, if you are willing, able and capable to serve. Attention - Motions for the October 2016 Business Meeting are due Tuesday, August 16th by 9:00 p.m., once you have received my acknowledgement it will be placed on the October Agenda. Reports are limited to 3 minutes. As they will be timed, I will give you a loving hint when you have 10 seconds remaining. At 3 minutes, I will thank you for your report; remember they will be included in our minutes. During the discussion with the motions we will keep the sharing to 2 minutes, if you have heard what you were about to share, remember everything needs to be said however not everyone needs to say it... Also, she encouraged us to reflect on how this is reconciled with the role of the trusted servant. Being able to receive mail and bring it to our groups...that's what we do. And, being anonymous within the fellowship is actually the opposite of the intention of Tradition 11. group contributions we received totaling \$31,455.53 from 410 groups. The Thank You letters were distributed yesterday at the Treasurers Meeting. It has been a relatively quiet 3 months until the past week and a half leading up to this Quarterly. The usual last minute changes but all is well and everything came out just as it was supposed to. We hit a speedbump this past Sunday when it became apparent that the Host District would be unable to sign the Food Waiver for the Hospitality Room, sometimes things crop up not anticipated and when least expected. Shirley and I discussed it and decided that this is a prime example of when "Right of Decision" becomes an important aspect of General Service. It would be unconscionable to not have a Hospitality room, so as the Area Chair, since the Area already signs on the master contract, Shirley signed the Food Waiver. I then contacted our Liability Insurance carrier on Monday to make sure that I read the policy correctly, and was assured that I had, any ill effects

pertaining hospitality room foods served are covered under the bodily injury portion of the policy with no exclusions. The Thank you letter as distributed to the District Treasurers all have one thing in common. The contribution address for Area 15 is prominently shown, bolded and in a large font, it's kinda tough to miss; however after 7 Quarterlies, there still are way too many Area contributions sent to former treasurers. This begs the question if the groups not actively participating in the District are getting these letters. I did a little private, un-scientific survey in my hometown, and found too many groups not getting their letters; in fact they didn't

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know these letters existed. It seems to me that this is a golden opportunity for the DCMs to shine and gives them an additional purpose for visiting these groups, hopefully interesting them in General Service. With our Alternate Delegate moving, her PO Box has been terminated, and as of the end of the month all mail, specifically contribution checks still being mailed to Annie as a past Treasurer, will be returned to sender. On June 5th our Support Your Services Committee was busy setting up everything for their Founders Day Picnic while I was busy watching the weather forecast as all the stations were calling for rain, no rain came but lots of AAs did, so many in fact that we had to send out for more food, I ended up as an unofficial Greeter/watermelon slicer and another successful picnic came to pass. We hold this event each year in the shadow of our first Tradition of Unity, to continue to work toward the common goal of providing a Solution to the insidious disease and fatal grip of Alcoholism. It doesn't matter whether you're a GSR, taking a meeting into a Jail or Intuition or answering the phones at Intergroup, you're doing Service work and that's Spiritual. District 9 is growing, our monthly business meetings welcome new GSRs and ALT/GSRs each month, we are placing ACMs in Sub Districts more often now which is really helping the groups stay informed. Our GSR Workshop coordinator, Karen V. with help from past Delegate Beth D. recently put on a skit about Motions which was extremely informative and humorous as we encourage everyone in our District to learn the importance of Motions at all levels. Archives, Support Your Services, Carry the Message Day, Gratitude Dinner Committee, all these are holding planning meetings now for future events, yes we're very busy, and very sober. Jackie S. is District 9s ACM/DCM Workshop coordinator and also our Assembly Chairperson, she is holding meetings now as District is happy to report we will be your hosts for the October Assembly, we look forward to seeing all of you then. God has given us a new life-one that works ! John

District 10: Hello Area 15, we bring you greetings from District 10, Miami-Dade County. All is well and our District has solid service participation in all committees. There is so much going on that I can only highlight a few things. Our annual Gratitude Dinner will be on November 12, our big event for fellowship and GSO fund raising. We are looking to triple purpose this with corresponding PI/CPC efforts, namely District 10 will be purchasing six tickets to invite friends of AA and has put out the word for groups to consider purchasing a ticket or two and inviting appropriate non-AA entities. Last year we did this on a trial basis and had the chaplain of a corrections facility and his guest in attendance. They were very impressed with us sober. The Literature committee has done a great job in developing a District 10 "New GSR Packet" to hand out to incoming trusted servants. Corrections is currently taking 13 meetings a week into 5 different facilities, County, State and Federal.

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As always, they are going through the normal transition of volunteers rotating in and replacing people that have rotated out. Fortunately we have more joining than rotating out. Treatment carries 260 one hour A.A. meetings into 22 facility locations. Three new facilities have recently engaged our services. We estimate over 700 A.A.'s participate in treatment service each month. The committee received 19 "bridge requests" this past quarter and 6 Man on the Bed service encounters. Fifteen A.A. home groups have enthusiastically embraced our new "Adopt a Treatment Facility Meeting Guidelines" and have adopted 90 A.A. monthly treatment facility meetings. We are encouraging more groups in 2016 to participate in this program so as to insure consistency of coverage and build enthusiasm for member participation in treatment service. Remote communities has been invited by GSO to be a validation source for Haitian Creole translation of the Big Book. The committee has started to take meetings to the Homeless Assistance Center (HAC). The committee is also very active in recruiting members to provide services to reach areas not easily accessible.

District 11: Thank you all for your service! Our District 11 (from Conch Key to Key West) has been growing with more trusted service willing to be of service. We are getting ready to adopt a new "Book of Current Practices" for our district and host a Service Workshop in September at the Key West Anchors Aweigh Club. We are happy to have our own Area 15 members- Shirley P. And Simmonne C. provide their experience, strength and hope with our District on Sunday September 18th regarding service and what the 12 concepts are all about. The 12 Concepts were recently introduced to our District at the Key West Anchors Aweigh Club and were put up on the wall there. This is the first time in our District that any AA group has ever displayed our 12 Concepts! The Key West AA groups recently collaborated to put on a 4th of July picnic and an open AA meeting at Fort Zachary Park. According to our intergroup Representative- there were over 125 members and their families in attendance. At one of the islands to the North of Key West there is a strong fellowship of "AA"ers too. The Big Pine Traditions group hosted their annual Memorial Day Picnic at Bahia Honda State Park with plenty of food, fun, and fellowship. Their next annual AA picnic take place on Labor Day at the same location and all are welcome. Marathon is around Mile Marker 55 and the AA meetings there area a little thinner in the summer months; but are still going on. A favorite meeting is the Mid-Keys group that meets at 10am each Sunday morning on Sombrero Beach at the first bath house. A booth was set up a booth at this meeting and AA literature was distributed. The Clergy outreach project continues with the mailing of AA pamphlets. District 1 will be hosting and staffing the PI/CPC table at the Florida State Convention. District 4: The District 4 PI/CPC Committee has presented to a variety of groups including CIT, the Health Dept Drs and LECOM is scheduled for an August presentation. The RACK PACK continues to provide AA approved materials to locations throughout our District. And the "Cinercial" with message: "IF YOU WANT TO DRINK, THAT'S YOUR BUSINESS. IF YOU WANT TO STOP, THAT'S OURS" is carried on every screen, before every show,

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in every theatre at the Parkway 8 Cinema on University Blvd. The "Cinercial" is seen by thousands of theatre patrons each week. District 6: In cooperation with the District 6 Treatment Facility Committee, CPC has formed a sub-committee to draft and send letters and personally approach the treatment facilities regarding the AA Traditions and Concepts. The Committee continues to resupply Probation / Parole Office, Sheriff's offices, bondsman's and attorney offices and police departments with beginner literature and open meeting schedules. Future initiatives include the ADAP counseling centers and the Federal prison, meeting with the professionals working there and offering open meeting schedules along with newcomer packets. District 7: The District 7 PI/CPC Committee has received a request from the Social Services Dept. at Florida Gulf Coast University to present to their future Social Workers in the classroom setting. SOUTH FLORIDA LEGACY OF SERVICE

“Our Twelfth Step - carrying the message - is the basic service that the A.A. Fellowship gives...Hence, an A.A. service is anything whatever that helps us to reach a fellow sufferer...” Co-founder Bill W. wrote these words to preface the first General Service Conference in 1951. Two Delegates selected by the statewide fellowship carried Florida's collective experience to that first get-together. It wasn't until 1957 when one was selected from the northern counties and one from the southern counties. As such, a Panel 7 Delegate represented South Florida from Miami. This first South Florida Delegate only served one year, and then the Alternate Delegate from Pompano Beach finished out that service period and subsequently was elected for two additional years. How best to carry the A.A. message has evolved through the years on an Area level as well as in the U.S./Canada. In Area 15, there are 16 committees focused on Area Business and the Redistricting Committee, composed of the seated District Chairs and chaired by the Alternate Delegate, which meets as necessary. These service committees meet four times a year to share experience. Each Area Committee Chairperson reports this activity to the Area Committee, which is composed of the Six Area officers, the chairpersons of each Area standing committee, and the District Committee Members (DCMs). Area 15 Business Meetings are held as Assemblies, where all Area Committee members and GSRs have a vote. Area Committee members may submit motions to the Business Meeting

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Assembly through the Area 15 Chairperson. Once a year, in April, there is an Assembly where all Area Committee members and GSRs have a voting voice to aid the Area 15 South Florida Delegate in carrying our conscience to the annual General Service Conference. (Taken from Legacy of Service L-4).

- Provides the Finance Committee with Chairperson's budget request at budget time.

- Sends out the English / Spanish versions (if available) of Assembly Minutes and Agenda, upcoming Assembly, and State convention flyers to the Current Panel, Committee members, and District Chairs.
- Present the Minutes for correction and approval at the Area Business Meeting.
- Provides 2 sets of Approved Minutes and CD(s) of the Area Business Meeting to the Area Archives Chairperson.
- Co-Chairs the District Secretaries’ sharing session, along with the Area Registrar at the Area Quarterlies.
- Provides the Finance Committee with Recording Secretary’s budget request at budget time.
